


Cats Haven's Mission:

Tiffany is a severe CH girl from a shelter up north. However, she did not come alone; she had 7 kittens with her. She and her 7 kittens were living outside at a trailer park. The 5 boys have gone to our adoption partner. The 2 girls are not ready yet.



Tiffany has some health issues that are being taken care of before she can be spayed. Her spay will be done at the clinic that handles our more affected CH cats. It is more costly to have a severe CH cat spayed or neutered due to the anesthesia risk, extra monitoring is needed during and after.

She will be available for adoption in mid to late Jan 2022. She is good with her litter box habits, would be best as a single cat or maybe just one other cat in the family. She cannot do stairs. Not good with dogs.

The best home for her would be with a family who has had a severe CH cat and knows how to care for one.

Abe is healing and doing well with his meds. It was a major undertaking, and it caused us a lot of worry because he is a severe CH guy.
